The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) submits its comments on House Bill No. 2775 entitled: "Philippine Bait-Ul-Mal Act," introduced by Representative Rufus B. Rodriguez, that seeks to institutionalize the payment of Zakat by Muslims and the establishment of Bait-Ul-Mal to alleviate poverty, promote and accelerate socioeconomic development in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM).

To contribute to the bill's enhancement, we are recommending the following:

- 1. The creation of a new office whose programs and services are already being carried out by various government agencies would entail additional expenses. We would recommend instead the strengthening of the National Commission on Muslim Filipinos (NCMF) to implement the provisions of the bill. Pursuant to the NCMF's Charter, it is authorized, subject to existing auditing rules and regulations, to give grants-in-aid out of its appropriations or other appropriate funds to cooperating government agencies for such programs, projects or services and other forms of assistance for the socioeconomic upliftment of Muslim Filipino communities.
- 2. The Department appreciates the recognition being accorded to it by the bill. However, may we emphasize that it is not a financial nor a revenue collecting agency but a social service institution.
- 3. The provisions of the bill should also cover other parts of the country with significant Muslim population and to increase the Non-Government Organization (NGO) representation into five (5) in the Board of Bait-Ul-Mal to be composed of Filipino Muslims themselves.

Attached is a copy of the DSWD's Official Position Paper during the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress articulating the same comments which was received by the House Committee on Muslim Affairs on January 15, 2018 for reference.
