Dear Chairperson Villanueva:

The Department of Social Welfare and Development supports Senate Bill No. 1149 entitled: An Act Creating the Youth Drug Abuse Resistance Education Program and Prevention and Providing Funds Therefor or the "Youth Drug Abuse Resistance Education and Prevention Program (Y-DARE) Act of 2016", introduced by the Chairperson.

To contribute to the bill's enhancement, we are recommending the following:

1. Sec. 1 — Short Title

To delete "of 2016"

2. Sec. 2 — Purpose

To revise the provision which will be read as follows:

"This Act is enacted for the purpose of providing the youth with appropriate **knowledge**, attitude, and skills to avoid opportunities of drug abuse by helping establish positive relationships between and among students and law enforcement agencies, teachers, parents and community leaders."

3. Sec. 3 — Implementation

- 3.1 The implementation of the Y-DARE and Prevention Program should not be limited to the Department of Health (DOH), Department of Education (DepEd) and Commission on Higher Education (CHED). May we recommend the involvement of other agencies such as the DSWD, Council for the Welfare of Children (CWC), Juvenile Justice and Welfare Council (JJWC), and National Youth Commission (NYC) which engage the most vulnerable sectors and work with at-risk children and youth.
- 3.2 To revise the function of the Department of Health (DOH) which will be read as follows:
 - ♣ On letter (b), do close coordination with the Dangerous Drugs Board (DBB) in the formulation and development of policy and legislative proposals and in the overall administration of policies and regulations related to drug prevention.
 - ♣ On letter (c), lead and convene the inter-agency committees, groups and partnerships related to drug prevention, coordinate with other government agencies on issues related to comprehensive school health, and advise the Secretary of the Department of Education (DepEd) and Commission on Higher Education (CHED) on the formulation of comprehensive school health education policy; and

- ♣ On letter (d), lead other government agencies in close coordination with the DDB in the development of a national research agenda for drug prevention.
- 3.3 To revise the functions of DepEd and CHED which will be read as follows:
 - ♣ On letter (d), build effective channels of communication between the school, parents, community leaders and partner offices and agencies to ensure that the educational and/or intervention programs are adequately carried out in and out of school.
- 4. Sec. 4 Implementing Rules and Regulations

To include the CHED, DSWD, CWC, JJWC, and TESDA in the formulation of the IRR.

5. Eurther, may we recommend to the Committee to invite concerned Local Government Units (LGUs) which are known for their successful implementation of the Special Drug Education Center (SDEC) which has been institutionalized under Republic Act No. 9165 or the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002" in the deliberation/s of this legislative measure.

The SDEC focuses on drug abuse prevention education at the community level, with at-risk children and youth as priority beneficiaries for this program.
